April earned her law degree from Stetson University College, in St. Petersburg, in 1997 and went on to become a Board Certified Specialist in Elder Law, certified by both the Florida Bar and the National Elder Law Foundation, and is also a member of The Council of Advanced Practitioners (CAP) for National Academy of Elder Law Attorneys. April earned her undergraduate degree in both sociology and Social Work from Christopher Newport University in Newport News, Virginia. Between college and law school April worked for non profit organizations including RSVP, a volunteer organization serving seniors, and within the nursing home industry.
